This “lab” course builds upon Christian Caregiving I to provide practice in the application of theory and theology in Christian caregiving. It also provides a brief survey of a number of presenting needs in caregiving. Students will engage in role plays, case studies, analyses of personal caregiving skills, and research and create a presentation on one common issue precipitating caregiving.

1. Nurture habits and disciplines of study, prayer and reflection that increase love of God and neighbor and shape personal and professional life
2. Be formed by, live in, and minister out of scripture, and the historical and theological tradition of the church

4. Integrate theology and practice in all areas of life and ministry

Class Objectives:

1. to provide practice in caregiving ministry
2. to understand and articulate biblical, theological and psychological foundations of care
3. to encourage the development of a healthy and faithful ministerial identity (lay or ordained)
4. to examine primary contexts and particular areas of need in caregiving
5. to strengthen essential communication skills

Evaluation:

1. Preparation for lab by review of Caregiving I concepts, and two brief verbatims for sessions.
2. Completion of Prepare and Enrich online training for care of married/engaged couples – 10%

3. Submission of four in-class worksheets providing feedback for classmates – 20%
4. Submission of three in-class worksheets reflecting on personal skills in class exercises– 15%
5. Case Study Paper, 6 pp. – 30%
6. Topical Issue in Caregiving presentation– 25%
