

HT 553 D UNITED METHODIST DOCTRINE

Instructor: Rev. Dr. Elmer M. Colyer
3 credits; letter grade

This course deals with the doctrine of the United Methodist Church and the theological heritage out of which it has grown. The course introduces students to the theology of John Wesley and the subsequent theological reflection within the Wesleyan tradition, including the Doctrinal Standards and Theological Task in the current Book of Discipline of the U. M. Church. There will be lectures, readings, and open class discussions. This course fulfills the disciplinary requirement of the United Methodist Church for candidates seeking ordination in that Church.

Course Objectives:

1. To understand the central themes of John Wesley's theology
2. To trace the theological tradition of the U.M. Church
3. To develop a clear grasp of PART III of The Book of Discipline
4. To reflect on & appropriate this theological heritage, including its discipleship & character formation
5. To be prepared to interpret and communicate this heritage in the life of local UM Churches
